Climb the tallest tower

It's 170 metres high with a glass bottom floor to walk over but don't worry, there's a lift to the top! Spinnaker Tower in Portsmouth is the iconic centrepiece of the redevelopment of Portsmouth Harbour. It's taller than the London Eye, Blackpool, Tower and Big Ben. And once you've seen the view, come back down to earth and mum will love the retail outlet Gunwharf Quays which surrounds it. Shop for a bargain before treating yourself to lunch or dinner at a choice of popular restaurants.

Run through the dunes

The stunning West Wittering beach is only minutes away and set in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty as beautiful as any south coast beach. Head for the dunes at 'land's end' and the kids will love running across the network of 'hidden' boards throughout the dunes . . . it's a great outdoors adventure.



Head under the sea

Sharks, rays, a tropical ocean display and underwater viewing tunnel ensure the Blue Reef Aquarium on Portsmouth sea front doesn't disappoint. Catch feeding time with the cheeky otters and get enchanted by the colourful and graceful species which call this home.

See the little people

Let the tots meet the little people at Southsea Model Village. A third of an acre of landscaped gardens inside the grounds of a Victorian fort creates a whole miniature world with tiny toy people and small-scale buildings. See the 100ft-long rifleman's tunnel, 10,000 gallon waterfall, the model of Portsmouth Guildhall and small toy museum.

Take a nature boat safari

Take a boat safari at Arundel Wetland Centre with an expert to point out the plants and wildlife around you. Try pond dipping, a reed bed walk and see kingfishers, bats, dragonflies and water voles . . . or even 100 or more Canada geese. And while you're in Arundel, why not head to its hill-top castle and pretend to be a soldier!



Spot the leopard

See the adorable new Amur leopard cub who has just been born at Marwell Wildlife. The precious little cub has made the first public appearance in her new habitat at the 140-acre zoological park near Winchester. The Amur leopard is an endangered species with less than 35 left in the wild in far-east Russia but you can see her clambering over logs and rocks and running around her new enclosure.

Build a sandcastle fortress

It's not too late in the season for some final bucket-and-spade fun. A £17 million coastal protection project has created a new golden beach on the waterfront at Bunn Leisure. Make the most of the bigger, better beach and go mad with your bucket-and-spade to create a whole moat island . . . the kids will love it!



Tikes on bikes

A new Royal Society for the Protection of Birds nature reserve scheme on Bunn Leisure's doorstep has created a network of cycle paths and walking routes to run wild. Get up close to nature and spot rare birds, water voles, great crested newts and reptiles . . . or just enjoy the panoramic viewpoints along the stunning coastline.

All the fun of the fair
