1. **The maritime city of Portsmouth**, home to the Historic Dockyard, Spinnaker Tower, Blue Reef Aquarium and luxury retail outlet Gunwharf Quays, where you can shop till' you drop and then dine in style at one of its 30 restaurants, bars and coffee shops, is just half an hour away.
2. Salute our Battle of Britain flying aces at **Tangmere Military Aviation Museum** and see the planes they flew in, including the spectacular Spitfire. Visitors on April 24 will be able to catch the cars of the Rotary Club of Croyden's Classic run which is calling in.
3. **The Weald and Downland Open Air Museum**. A few miles away at Singleton, near Chichester, you can explore 50 historic buildings in a beautiful 40-acre park. Visitors on May 1-2 will be able to join the park's Food & Folk Festival.
4. Hop on a free bus from Bunn Leisure to find the hidden delights of **charming Chichester**. Visit its impressive cathedral and wander around its wealth of boutique shops in a relaxing, pretty, traditional setting for leisurely shopping at its best.
5. **Aldingbourne Trust**. Visit their Open Farm, explore the children's play area and play a round of Mini golf or drive a pedal tractor.
6. **Fishbourne Roman Palace** is Britain's largest Roman home and just a few miles from Warner Farm, complete with giant mosaics, a museum of artefacts and lots of lovely Easter activities for the children
7. **West Sands Funfair**. A hop and a skip away at Selsey, West Sands offers a roller coaster, bouncy castle, trampolines, a waltzer and kids' rides, and all for £10, all day, from, 12-noon-5pm.
8. From marvellous meerkats to terrific – and highly endangered – Tigers, **Marwell Zoo** is the place to get closer to some of the world's most beautiful and endangered species. From March 25-28 they'll be hosting their Easter Egg hunt with daily activities for children.
9. **Amberley Museum and Heritage Centre** – 36 acres of transport heritage fun including a narrow-gauge railway. On Sunday April 24 they have a historic bus gathering and a traditional crafts weekend takes place from Sunday May 29 to Monday May 30.
10. Crab and cockles. If you like seafood, **Selsey** is known for its crab and boasts some of the best seafood in the British Isles. Enjoy cockles on the beach or go for a full-blown dining experience at a choice of local restaurants.
